Pastor's Ponderings September, 2015



Dear Beloved People of God at St. Paul's,

The end of summer and the beginning of a new year of Christian education is a good time to evaluate the ministry at St. Paul's.

God knows there is a very strong core of believers here who love the Lord and serve Him unselfishly. They are dedicated and faithful to God and His Word. Many in this core are of an older generation and one that in the not-too-distant future will find it difficult to fulfill vital roles within the church.

This is by no means a new challenge. Of course, it happens in every church in every age. A concern I have is with the dedication of many Christians (not only here) who are in the midst of adulthood who appear to believe that gathering with God's people for worship and prayer is of secondary importance, forgetting the words, "Seek first the Kingdom of God," and "Remember the Sabbath Day by keeping it holy."

This is a truly dangerous age in so many ways. Attention is in a thousand different places with media such as it is (social networks, iPhones, pads, pods, etc.,); and fewer and fewer people are hearing the voice of God which cries out: "Be still, and know that I am the LORD." Where do attentions lie? What is more important than knowing God and hearing His life-giving Word regularly? Is there a substitute for praising Jesus Christ for His free gift of life and salvation? Is there anything more important than growing in Christ and receiving strength and guidance to serve Him each day? What should take precedence over being equipped to influence the sin-drenched, dying world around us?

I am equally concerned for those who have children who are not instilling in them the importance of being in God's house weekly. For those of you who ARE here most every week, God bless you for leading by example in your regular worship and being the model in your child's life as a family who is dedicated to God. How important for his/her generation to know the God who gives us life, salvation, and every good gift from above!

You may have noticed that church attendance could certainly be stronger. This summer's attendance has been weak compared to the past. Being human, I'm thinking, "Why are they staying away? Has my preaching gone south? Has their love for Christ gone cold? Are their IPhones and internet usage keeping them away? Am I not generating interest in God's Word?"

The fact is Christ builds His Church; no one comes to the Father unless He draws them. As many as God appoints to eternal life believe.

For those who are in the church, the body of Christ, it is our duty to dedicate our lives to God. If not, what happens? Like a plant without water, we shrivel up and die. Faith dies. Our homes lack the vital presence of Christ, His love and reconciliation. Peace within the heart disappears. Then we are left with nothing. If this is the case with individuals within the church, then we become a church body that fades in her influence in this world that God has called us to transform by our life and witness. God forbid that should happen here!

The Lord is undoubtedly calling us to prayer - for ourselves, for each other, to be a strong and lasting influence in our community. Please examine your life as I examine mine, and our intention to serve and love Christ with all our being in this age that wants to turn us away from God.

Together, let's prepare our hearts for a special year, growing in the grace and knowledge of Jesus, and abounding in His love!

MISSION GRANT STORY

CLEAN WATER AND EVANGELISM MINISTRY \$50,000

Mission Opportunities Short Term (MOST) Ministries is impacting the world for Jesus Christ through short term mission trips. Working through partnerships with congregations, mission organizations, LCMS missionaries, and LCMS partner churches they provide medical and dental clinics, eyeglasses, hospice care training, women's and children's ministry, construction, ethics training for policemen and soldiers, and many other projects.
