Pastor's Ponderings
May, 2020

Dear Christian Brothers and Sisters,

Here we are, still wondering when our lives will return to "normal". As of this writing, some places are slowly beginning to emerge from this surreal state we are in due to this strange virus; how far and how fast we'll emerge, only time will tell.

As we know, countless discussions in countless homes have taken place; some of these discussions exude fear, some skepticism, and some disbelief. Emotions have run the gamut, as have proposed solutions from all walks.

Thoughtful Christians and those familiar with the Bible should look at our current situation from God's perspective. If we believe that the Lord is ultimately in charge of everything that takes place on this earth, we understand that God is well-aware of our plight, and has allowed it to occur. The book of Daniel reminds us *"God does as He pleases with the powers of heaven and the peoples of the earth. No one can hold back His hand or say to Him, 'What have You done?'"* (Daniel 4:35).

Next, the questions come; "Can we discern the voice of the Lord in all this? What is the Lord trying to tell us, if anything?" We can answer by asking another question: "What was God trying to tell His people of old when they would encounter trials and tests of their faith?"

Many are the times when the Lord would "get the attention" of the nation of Israel when they would fall into idolatry and take their eyes off of Him (see the Book of Judges). There are plenty of us in our day who take our eyes off Christ and fall into any number of forms of idolatry. This happens whenever we say "no" to God and "yes" to our own will, which often runs contrary to His. Our "idols" can be anything that takes precedence over our relationship to God.

As a whole, we, as a country, are living contrary to the will of God with another idol in place - the idol of

self. Lost are the words of Jesus which tell us to *deny ourselves, take up our cross and follow Him*. To take up the cross is to seek God first, be prepared to suffer for His namesake, all the while following Jesus and trusting Him.

I believe our Lord is using this current "crisis" in our time to get our attention. He is reminding us that we need Him for everything that pertains to this body and life, and we are to acknowledge Him in all things and thank Him continually for granting us blessing after blessing, day after day.

The Lord wants us to acknowledge that His Word is truth (John 17:17) and we are to believe it and live consistently by that Word. We are never to live in gross, blatant sin and follow its dictates. This holds true for everyone born into this world.

Unfortunately, so many people have chosen to forsake the Word of the Lord and participate in whatever the sinful mind of man can dredge up. We know that in time it spills over into every corner of society. We see it all over. The Lord is leaving us a poignant and serious message. It's no mistake that He has allowed America's corporate worship to be stricken from our landscape and to have other things plucked away from us, including the livelihood of many. Now, many can see how empty life can be without worshipping the Lord often and together, how much we need Him, and that the superficial can never fill the God-shaped void in the heart of man. It doesn't work.

When the time comes for us to return to "normal", hopefully our new "normal" will be much different in that Jesus Christ and the will of God will occupy our thoughts more than ever. Pray fervently that it be so!

Synod Chaplain Issues Scripture Memory Challenge

The LCMS has a suggestion for how to spend some of your free time during the pandemic: **Memorize Verses of Scripture together!**

The Director of Worship and International Center, Chaplain Rev. Sean Daenzer issued The Psalm 91 Challenge over LCMS social media, encouraging members of the Synod to memorize the psalm over a couple of weeks. LCMS Communications decided to take the opportunity to launch a memory initiative. The verses will be selected primarily from the Gospels and Epistles. Most of the selections will be short, just one or two verses at a time.

Daenzer said that "memorizing scripture is a valuable practice for Christians, even in the digital age, we're so connected with everything digitally, and we have information at our fingertips, but if that were ever to go out, what would we know? Almost nothing." When Jonah was in the belly of the whale, it was too late to pull out his Bible. It was too late to grab his catechism and his hymnal. . . The great song of Jonah in Chapter 2 is nothing but pieces of the psalms stitched together. They're childhood memory verses and bedtime prayers that he was able to use in the total darkness of the whale to pray faithfully, to bring God's Word to bear on his situation, and to comfort himself in the midst of great distress. "And that's exactly why we learn the Scriptures now: We never know when persecution may come, when technology or even access to Bibles and churches may go away. We're getting a taste of that now in the quarantine time. So it drives home the point that we need to have Scripture . . . on our hearts and minds."

Daenzer offered a few tips for effective memorization:

"Small, short bites, repeated many times, are way better than one giant 'cram' session. Take 2 minutes every night and say it through twice together, or once in the morning and once in the evening."

"Music always helps us to memorize more easily and then retain it. Sing anything that can be sung, either to a tune you know, or to a simple tone like one of the psalm tones in the hymnal".

If you have a Bible translation they you've started memorizing in, don't feel like you have to switch translations whenever a new one comes along. Whatever you're familiar with will be just fine."

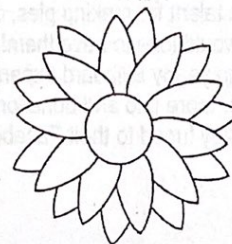

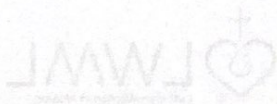
Our dear Co-workers for Christ at St. Paul's, Kenesaw

TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH TRANSPORTATION

Mobile, Alabama — \$58,000

As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace (1 Peter 4:10).

Trinity Lutheran Church of Mobile, Alabama, and their pastor, Rev. Dr. Ulmer Marshall, have a genuine heart for the people in their community. They seek many and diverse ways to connect and serve those who are often under-served and overlooked. As Rev. Marshall has shared with his congregation, "A church is in a community to serve that community. It's our job."

The school of Trinity Lutheran is the last remaining school begun through Rosa Young's ministry located in Mobile, Alabama. With prayer, patience, and its Christ-centered purpose, Trinity Lutheran School serves 200 students from infants through fifth graders. All the students qualify for free lunches, and many receive tuition assistance. Its after school program and Good News Bible Club reaches an additional 45 students.

Trinity Lutheran has remained a stronghold of Christ-centered education in a community dealing with inter-generational poverty and the challenges of urban living by "promoting Christian faith and life-long learning of the whole child in a changing world." Most parents of the children at Trinity are single moms under age 30, who are un- or under-employed, and live in substandard housing.

Because Trinity Lutheran Church is serving the most vulnerable people in their community, this ministry is committed to providing assistance to meet some of the physical needs as well as the spiritual needs of those in the area. The Ministry in Motion at Trinity in Mobile, Alabama grant funds will enable Trinity to purchase a sturdy, handicapped accessible, and well-built church bus for elders, school children, neighbors, and church members to participate in church and school ministries both on and off campus.

For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope (Jeremiah 29:11).

LCMS STEWARDSHIP MINISTRY NEWSLETTER ARTICLE – MAY 2020

Our Savior calls us to follow Him in generosity. "For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you." (John 13:15) We cannot give our lives for the salvation of the world, of course. Praise God – that job's already done!

But with hearts full of thanksgiving for what Jesus has given us, we can follow Jesus' example of generous giving. And this is not merely an example alone. It's also our Lord's command. "The one who contributes, (let him give) in generosity." (Rom. 12:8)

So, when we give to help others who are in need, and when we bring offerings to the Lord, we should strive to heed His command and follow the pattern He has established for us. Jesus did not give us leftovers. He gave His best. So, we should not give leftovers, either, but the first and best of what He has given us. Jesus did not give as an afterthought, but according to the plan of salvation God established from the foundation of the world.

So, when it comes to our offerings to the Lord, we should make a thoughtful plan to give generously, in proportion to the way He has blessed us. Like the Macedonian Christians, who gave according to their ability – and even beyond their ability (2 Cor. 8:3) – we can and should give a generous portion of the income that God provides us to honor the Lord.

So also, we should give freely, just as Jesus gave freely for us. There is no compulsion involved in our works of love and our offerings to the Lord. Nor do we give grudgingly. We should give freely and cheerfully because we want to out of thanksgiving. "Each as he purposes in his heart," as the Lord says. (2 Cor. 9:7) There is no New Testament ceremonial law involved here. Rather, we are free to give as generously as our Savior has given for us.

In the same way, our Lord teaches us to give generously out of love – love for Him and for our neighbor. Genuine love is always love in deed (1 John 3:18), love such as Jesus showed us all. It is love that sees our neighbor in need and gives generously to help him. It is love that hears the Word of the Lord and does what it says. If we truly love, we give generously. If we give without love, our giving is not truly following Jesus.

Finally, we follow Jesus in generosity when we give for a good purpose to thank the Lord and support His gospel ministry and other works of mercy. The people of Israel gave generously for the service of God's gospel purposes, to construct and support the operation of the tabernacle. For that was the place where the Lord received the Old Testament sacrifices, through which He bestowed the forgiveness of sins on His people. So, they gave abundantly – so abundantly that they had to be told to stop giving. (Ex. 36:5-6)

In the same way, we should bring generous offerings to support the Lord's work of bestowing His gifts of forgiveness, life, and salvation in our congregations through the preaching and teaching of His Word, Baptism, and the Lord's Supper. We should support the Lord's work of caring for those who are poor and needy.

Our Savior calls us to follow His example in generous giving. Let us then, with thankful hearts, rededicate ourselves to following Him in generosity.

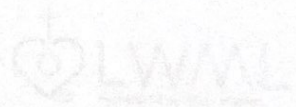

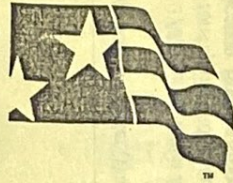
